RCRA IN-HOUSE DIVISIONS EXPLAINED

Beginner - Walk

Riders will compete in one walk equitation flat focused on quality of position, halt and forward transitions. Riders will also compete in a poles course judged for equitation and accuracy through the poles course at the walk.

Leadline entries are permitted.

Novice - Walk / Trot

Riders will compete in one walk/trot equitation flat focused on quality of position and transitions. Riders will also compete in a poles course judged for equitation and accuracy through the poles course at the trot.

Intermediate - Walk / Trot / Canter

Riders will compete in one walk/trot/canter equitation flat focused on quality of position and transitions. Riders will also compete in a poles course judged for equitation and accuracy through the poles course at the trot.

Junior Cross Rails

Riders will compete in one walk/trot/canter equitation flat focused on quality of position and transitions. Riders will also compete in a simplified jump course judged for equitation and accuracy through the course at a trot or canter.

Senior Cross Rails

Riders will compete in one walk/trot/canter equitation flat focused on quality of position and transitions. Riders will also compete in 2 crossrail jump courses judged for equitation and accuracy through the course at the canter. Riders can be asked for additional commands (ie. no stirrups)

Hi-Low

Riders will compete in one walk/trot/canter equitation flat focused on quality of position and transitions. Riders will also compete in 2 jump courses judged for equitation and accuracy through the course at the canter. Riders can be asked for additional commands (ie. no stirrups)
